**What Are Symptoms of Black Mold in Dogs?**

Black mold, also known as *Stachybotrys chartarum*, lurks in dark corners and hides in cabinets in the days, months and even years after a house has been flooded by water. While it's been known for many years that black mold causes respiratory problems and pulmonary hemorrhage in humans, the first documented case of it causing illness in pets didn't come until 2005. Before then, black mold had not been associated with disease in pets.

**History**

The first documented case of toxic black mold and its effects on pets came when two Himalayan cats were undergoing a routine dental cleaning at Marathon Veterinary Hospital in Florida. The two brother felines were under anesthesia when the veterinarian saw blood forming in the tubes that provided the anesthesia during the procedure.

One of the cats died the next day and the other died two weeks later.

The veterinarian, Dr. Douglas Mader, stated that what happened was abnormal because anesthesia doesn't cause pulmonary hemorrhage.

The veterinarian, after talking to the cats' guardians, learned that they lived in a home that had sustained water damage in a hurricane a couple years earlier. Black mold was found in the home after the cats' deaths.

**Causes**

Black mold grows in areas with high humidity. Homes that have been flooded or suffered other major water damage are particularly susceptible. The spores of black mold contain different kinds of mycotoxins that are dangerous to the health of people and animals.

**Symptoms**

The effects of black mold poisoning can range from mild respiratory disease to lung trauma. The black mold poisoning causes weakening of the capillaries in the lungs and when the capillaries are stressed, they burst and bleed. Complications from the hemorrhaging of their lungs is what killed the two Himalayan cats.

## What Are Symptoms of Black Mold in Dogs? (cont)

### At-Risk

While little information is yet available on black mold and pets, veterinarians are urging pet guardians to exercise caution if their companion animals must undergo anesthesia and there is a chance they have been exposed to black mold.

Guardians should tell their veterinarians about their pet's possible exposure and veterinarians should ask more questions of pet guardians to determine if their patients might be at risk.

### Complications

If your pet does undergo anesthesia and complications arise that suggest your dog or cat may be poisoned by black mold, such as a bloody respiratory discharge during the procedure, the anesthesia should be stopped immediately.

Initially your pet will be treated with corticosteroids to try to stabilize the capillary epithelium. Your pet will then likely be given antibiotics to help prevent bacteria growth which could lead to secondary pneumonia.

## **Corresponding Secretary**

This article is strictly an information one detailing everything we have coming up in the new few months, so it would be a good idea to read it.

First, the Breed Standard Proposal Ballots are almost ready to go out. They should be in the mail no later than July 1st, 2011. I will send an email to the NAEDA members list when they are in the mail. I hope that those of you that know people that are not on the list will let them know, so they will be looking for the ballots. If you do not receive one, and your dues were paid on time, please contact me immediately.

Please remember, It is an election year. The following details the nomination process and the balloting process. If you, or someone you know would like to become an NAEDA officer, please follow the directions carefully.

The nomination must be made by another NAEDA member in good standing. The Corresponding Secretary of the Association must receive the nomination at least sixty (60) days prior to the Fall Meeting. The Fall Meeting is October 22, 2011 this year. Nominations are due to me NO LATER THAN AUGUST 20, 2011. No nominations will be taken from the floor. No National Officer may endorse a candidate for office on the NAEDA ballot. In the case of only one (1) eligible nomination for each position on the Executive board is received by the Corresponding Secretary on or before the deadline date, the slate of candidates shall be declared elected at the time of the annual meeting and no balloting will be required. The notice of the upcoming election and the nomination deadline shall be posted by the Corresponding Secretary in each appropriate newsletter sent to the membership during the year of the election. The exact language of paragraph A of this section shall be included in the election notice. If any position on the Executive Board receives more than (1) eligible nominee a written ballot will be mailed to the membership as provided in paragraphs B, C, D, and E that follow.

The Corresponding Secretary will mail a written ballot to each individual and senior member who was in good standing as of July 1st of that year. This will ensure that all members in good standing will receive a ballot within the proper time. Candidates for election must be placed on the ballot in alphabetical order. Along with the ballot the Corresponding Secretary shall provide each member an envelope marked "BALLOT" and an address label containing the member's name and address. Clear and complete instructions for the written ballot process including deadlines, postmark procedure, and ballot envelope identification must be sent with each written ballot.

Envelopes marked "Ballot" must be returned by mail and must be received by the Corresponding Secretary no later than 120 hours prior to the announced time of the General Membership meeting at which the results of the ballot are to be announced.. All members need to be responsible for mailing the ballot back in time to meet the

deadline. Envelopes must have the member's return name and address on them.

Envelopes marked "BALLOT" shall not be opened prior to counting time. Ballots shall be opened and counted at the Fall meeting by a committee selected by the President. The results of the balloting shall be certified as directed by the General Membership in the Policies of the organization. The Parliamentarian shall rule upon any questions concerning the legality of a ballot. The results of the election, as determined by the committee shall be presented to the membership during the Fall Meeting.

I also want to remind everyone about the AOM and AOMX awards. Please get your application and money to me as soon as possible, so that I can verify the get either through the Bloodlines or with the UKC and notify Sally Bedow in time for her to order the plaques. The Application for same follows.






